Dance2Care - a collaborative fundraiser providing an opportunity for the Network and its member agencies to raise money for their programs and increase public awareness. Member agencies participating in the dance-a-thon receive 75% of monies collected and the Network retains 25% to coordinate and produce the event.

Adult Day Services are community-based healthcare programs for low income seniors and younger disabled adults enabling them to continue living independently in the community. Adult Day Services helps in lowering risk of falls, reducing emergency and hospital visits, counteracting depression and delaying/preventing the isolation of institutional care. The member centers annually serve nearly 2,000 participants; of which, 73% are 70+ years. Caregivers are provided education and support and critical respite from the stress of caregiving, emotionally and financially.

The Network is all about healthcare in everything we do! We hope Dance2Care will benefit you physically, mentally and emotionally through the opportunity to dance and move AND through a fun, engaging and social atmosphere with rewarding incentives, entertainment and good-natured fun activities.

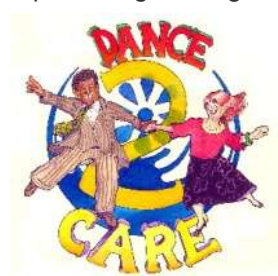

2:00 – Argentine Tango – Noelle Caskey & Darren Lees Song: "Recuerdo" Artist: Lalo Schifrin



Noelle's dance career began when she learned the Scottish sword dance in second grade. Before she began partner dancing, she studied the modern dance techniques of Martha Graham, Humphrey-Weidman, and Isadora Duncan. In 2003 she danced her first competition in cha cha, rumba, bolero, East Coast swing, and mambo. She continued to compete for the next few years, adding salsa, samba, nightclub 2 step, hustle, and West Coast swing to her repertory, as well as a number of solo routines. She began studying and performing Argentine tango with Darren Lees in 2006. Their most recent performance was *The Many Moods of Tango* in fall of 2009.



A Member of the Screen Actors Guild, Darren splits his time between Southern and Northern California. His first experience with dance came at the age of nine, spending three years performing the Jarabe Tapatio, a Mexican folkloric dance from Guadalajara. He has spent the last nine years immersed in the Argentine Tango traveling to Buenos Aires, teaching and performing in numerous communities around North America including tango festivals such as the *Los Angeles Tango Masquerade*, *Maui Tangofest*, *Reno's Tango Brujo*, and the *Tango at Sea Cruises*. Recent stage shows include *Ted Viviani's TANGO X3* at San Francisco's Palace of Fine Arts, San Francisco's *For the Love of Dance*, and The 28th annual San Francisco Ethnic Dance Festival at the Palace of Fine Arts.

She then competed for two years in International Latin studying with Dave Stewart and Grace Kato. Upon discovering hustle and west coast swing she switched gears and is now in her second season of competitive dancing with her hustle coach Raul Ante and working with World hustle champ Billy Fajardo. This will be her first west coast swing performance and the kick off of her competitive season. Becky is dancing for her mother, who is living with Alzheimer's today.



Robert is a very well-rounded social dancer in all ballroom and nightclub dances but his passion lies in the art of west coast swing. He is making his first public performance today and is also kicking off his competitive season in the up and coming months. Outside of dancing he is a realtor, is very musically inclined and has a black belt in Jujitsu.

Prior to learning Argentine Tango, Lisa spent several years dancing Lindy Hop and all 10 International Ballroom dances. She and her Lindy Hop partner took Gold in Fast Swing at the August 2005 United States Same-Sex Dance Championships. Since her introduction to Argentine Tango a few years ago, she's changed her focus entirely to Argentine Tango and hasn't looked back.

After dancing Modern in high school, Mira was introduced to Lindy Hop, Blues, and Contact Improv at Oberlin College, and eventually found Argentine Tango in 2006 and fell immediately in love with the dance. Mira plans to spend time in Buenos Aires in the coming months to immerse herself in the culture, and she also enjoys

dancing Tango-Blues Fusion and Tango-Contact Improv Fusion.

A last minute happenstance led Lisa and Mira to compete together in Argentine Tango at the October 2009 California Dreaming Same-sex Dancesport Festival, where they earned a first place finish. Since then, they've competed in the Dancing in the River City and April Follies same-sex dance competitions.
